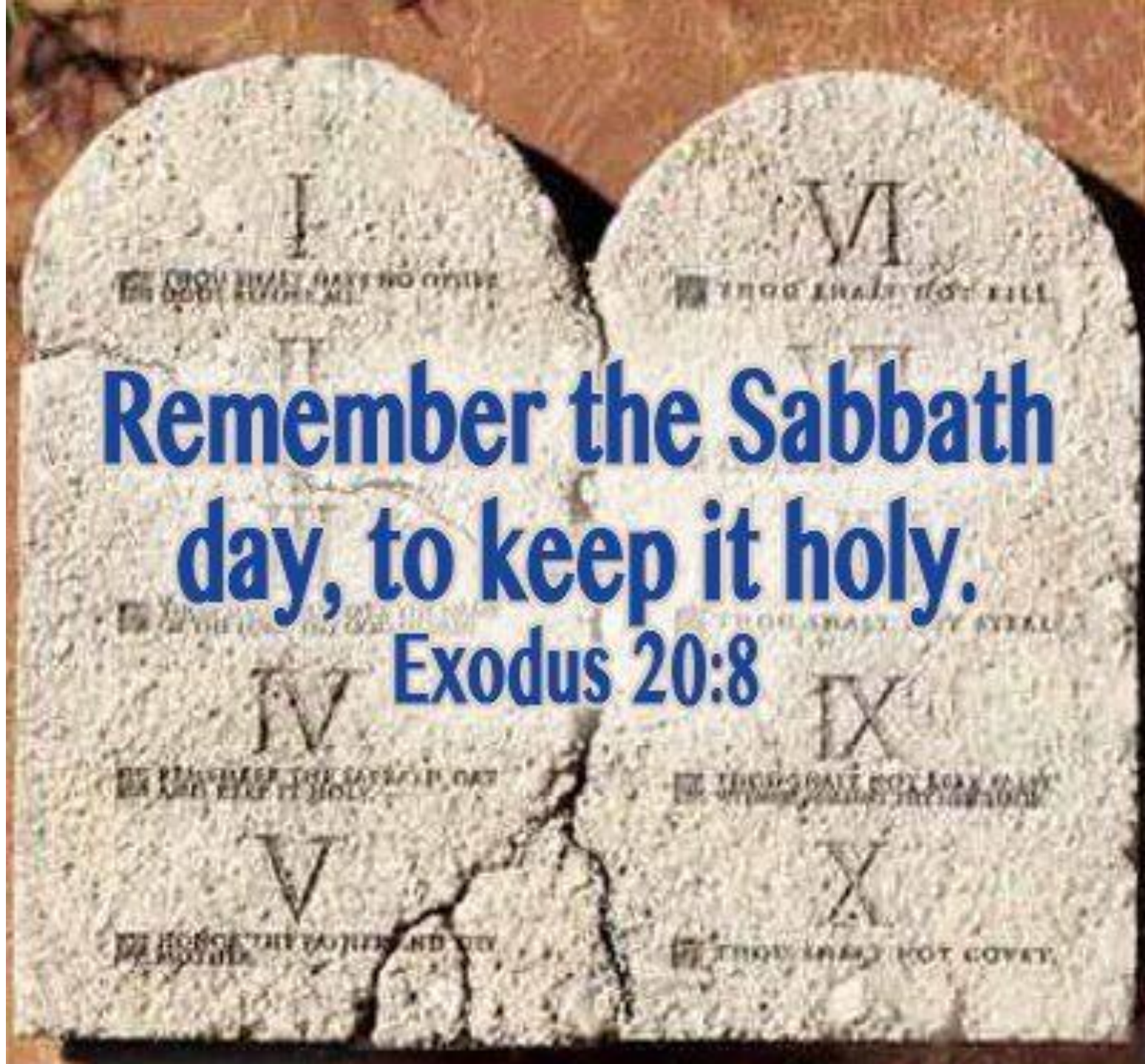

For Jews – Saturday

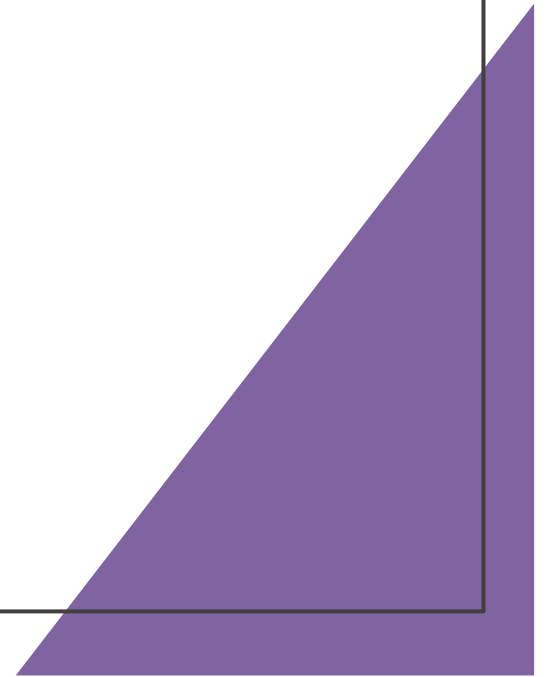
Jews are still preparing themselves for their savior to come.

The day that Jesus Christ, our Savior, rose from the dead.

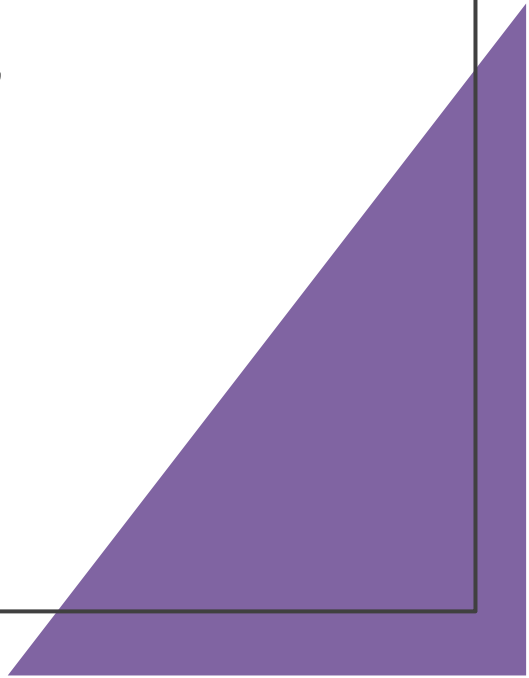
Each Sunday is like Easter, we are celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord and his triumph over death.

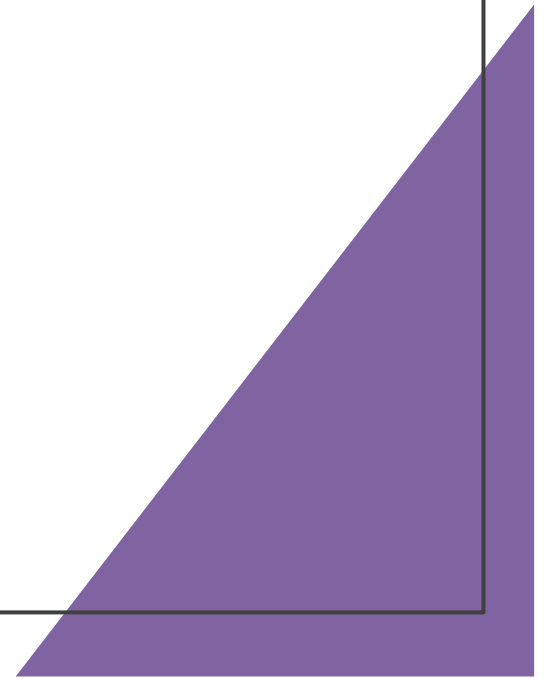

Jan 1 – Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God

Jan 6 – Epiphany (Mathew 2 : 1 - 12)

Feb 14 – Ash Wednesday

Mar 19 – Feast of St. Joseph

Mar 30 – Good Friday

40 days after Easter – Ascension Thursday

May 31st - Corpus Christi – (1st Thursday after Pentecost.)

June 29 – Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul

Aug 15 – The Assumption of Mary

Nov 1 – All Saints Day

Dec 8 – Immaculate Conception

Dec 25 - Christmas
