The Sacraments of Initiation: Becoming Christian, Becoming Church

What is a Sacrament?

<u>Answer:</u> Sacrament is an outward sign of an inward grace received. It is a personal encounter with Jesus which reveals his love for us.

2. Which are the Seven Sacraments and what do they celebrate? Answer:

Sacrament of Initiation

- Baptism: our sinful self has been nailed to the cross and buried with Jesus, and that through his resurrection we have come alive to a brand new reality.
- Confirmation: strengthens, completes, & confirms the graces and gifts of the Holy Spirit we initially received at baptism. Baptism begins New life; confirmation strengthens New life.
- The Eucharist: Jesus saving death and presence in our midst. With consecration, the substances of bread and wine actually become the substances of the body and blood of Jesus Christ

Sacrament of Healing

- Reconciliation: With repentance, we celebrate God's healing power through forgiveness. Confession also permits reconciliation with the Church, which is wounded by our sins.
- Anointing of the Sick: The ultimate mission of the Sacrament is to raise us up on the Last Day with God's healing love.

Sacrament of Service

- Marriage: binds one man and one woman together in a Covenant of Love under God and His Church and sanctifies them on the way to eternal life.
- Holy orders: the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church: thus it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry.

3. Briefly explain the Sacrament of Baptism?

<u>Answer:</u> The <u>Sacrament of Baptism</u>, the first of the sacraments of initiation, is an entrance into the Catholic Church. Through baptism, we are cleansed of original sin and receive <u>sanctifying grace</u>, the life of God within our souls. This grace prepares us for the receiving the other sacraments and **helps us to live a holy life**.


4. Briefly explain the Sacrament of Confirmation?

<u>Answer:</u> The <u>Sacrament of Confirmation</u> is the second Sacraments of Initiation. Sacrament of Confirmation is regarded as the perfection of baptism, and it gives us the grace to be strong in faith.

5. Briefly explain the Sacrament of Eucharist?

Answer: The final sacrament of initiation is the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and Catholics believe that it is the only one of the three that we can (and should) receive repeatedly—even daily, if possible. In Holy Communion, we consume the Body and Blood of Christ, which unites us more closely to Him and gives us the grace to love Jesus and our neighbor.
