Barnabas and Saul in Iconium, Lystra and Derbe and return to Antioch in Syria

1. What caused Paul and Barnabas to travel to Lystra and Derbe? (Acts 14:05-6)
Answer: They fled the efforts of both Jews and Gentiles to abuse and stone them.
2. What prompted Paul to heal the crippled man from birth in Lystra? (Acts 14:09)
Answer: Paul saw that the man had faith to be healed.
