- Q1. What is a Sacrifice?
 - An act of offering something to God, that is precious to us. E.g; At the Holy Mass we can offer ourselves to God for we are precious to God.
- Q1. What is the Mass?
 - The Mass is the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, offered in our church by the priest.
- Q2. Why is the Mass (Eucharist) a sacrifice of thanksgiving offered to God?

 The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all that he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification.
- Q3. When was the sacrament of the Eucharist instituted?

 Jesus instituted the sacrament of Eucharist on Holy Thursday on the night before his passion (Matthew 26:26–28; Mark 14:22–24; and Luke 22:17–20)
- Q4. Who instituted the Eucharist, and why?

 Jesus instituted the Eucharist as a pledge of his love and as a reminder for us that he (God) is with us forever.
- Q5. What did Jesus tell his apostles to do?

 Jesus told his Apostles to do this in remembrance of Him (Luke 22:19)
- Q6. What happens to the bread and wine at the time of Consecration?

 At the time of Consecration, the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus.
