

LESSON 9 - CHRISTIAN MORALITY: WHAT DOES LOVE LOOK LIKE?

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

1. What do you understand by “God is love, and he who abides in love, abides in God and God abides in them”?

Answer: The Gospels have many passages that focus on the nature of love. The above line presents a very powerful message : that whenever and wherever we love another, God is present in a special way. That makes all relationships holy and sacred.

2. In what is the law of love presented?

Answer: The law of love is presented in the Hebrew Scriptures, through the Ten Commandments.

3. Where was the 10 Commandments given and to whom?

Answer: The 10 commandments was given to Moses on Mount Sinai.

4. Which are the Commandments that speaks about God and what does it say?

Answer: **Commandment 1 to 3 – On God?**

2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
3. Remember to keep holy the Lord’s Day or Sabbath day.

8. Which Commandment is the foundation of Christian morality?

Answer: Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.

10. What does Reign of God mean?

Answer: It is the rule of God’s love over the HEARTS of people, and a new social order based on unconditional love of God and others.
