

- 3. Paul has been traveling through Macedonia and Greece where he stayed  $\underline{3}$  / 5 / 6 months. 5. He left and sent some of the men traveling with him ahead to  $\underline{\text{Troas}}$ . 6. The text states we and us, so  $\underline{\text{Luke}}$  is traveling with them. They finally arrived in Troas and stayed for 6 /  $\underline{7}$  / 10 days.
- 7. On the <u>first</u> / last day of the week, the <u>disciples</u> were together to break bread. Paul preached until <u>midnight</u> because they were leaving the next day. 8. The <u>lamps</u> were lit and <u>Eutychus</u> was sitting in a <u>window</u>. He fell into a deep <u>sleep</u> and jumped / <u>fell</u> out of the window on the first/second / <u>third</u> floor and <u>died</u> / woke up.
- 10. Paul went down to him and embraced him. He told everyone, "He <u>lives</u>." 12. The people were <u>comforted</u> / sad Eutychus was alive!
- 17. Paul sent for the <u>elders</u> in Ephesus from Miletus. 19. When they arrived, Paul reminded them he served the Lord with <u>humility</u>, <u>tears</u> and <u>trials</u>. 21. He taught <u>repentance</u> toward God, and <u>faith</u> toward Jesus. 22. Now he was going to <u>Jerusalem</u> and did / <u>didn't</u> know what would happen to him. 23. The Holy Spirit states that <u>chains</u> and problems are waiting there and 25. they would / <u>wouldn't</u> see him again.
- 24. Paul said none of these things move him, "so that I may <u>run</u> my <u>race</u> with joy.
- 27. Paul declared the part / <u>whole</u> counsel of <u>God</u>. 28. He said that as elders, they needed to watch all the <u>flock</u> because they are the overseers in charge to <u>shepherd</u> the church which <u>Jesus</u> purchased with His <u>blood</u>.
- 35. Paul continued his warnings and said to support the strong / <u>weak</u> and remember <u>Jesus</u> said, "It is more <u>blessed</u> to <u>give</u> / take than to <u>receive</u>."
