FORMATION 10 – THE CALL TO JUSTICE SOCIAL SIN & THE MESSAGE OF JESUS

OBJECTIVE: To help candidates evaluate modern culture in the context of their new understanding of sin.

To help them reflect on how they might take action to counter the effect of cultural sin in the lives of young people today.

The importance of Reconciliation in our journey of faith.

Jesus says whatsoever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.

The negative values found in our culture.

- 1) Excessive Consumerism: To acquire more goods, many may be totally unnecessary.
- 2) <u>Extreme individualism:</u> We think of ourselves first we forget our responsibility to others. We loose the sense of common good. Remain totally independent.
- 3) <u>Instant gratification</u>: We want and expect all our needs and desires to be met right now. Make my life easy now.

What is Jesus' message to us?

- How can I share what I have with others.
- How can I help bring people together
- Am I willing to loose my life now in order to ultimately save it.



BIBLE 1 SAMUEL CHAPTER 24



In this chapter we see David had an easy opportunity to kill Saul and become the next king. Even after he cuts the corner of his rope he is not happy. He leaves it into God's hand. He also respects one of the commandments "You shall not kill". He also knew how to wait on the Lord. What you and I would do in this situation? Kill the opposite and take the law in our hands or leave it up to the legal authorities. Like David we should wait on the Lord by prayer & patience. The Lord will show us the way. We often forget that God has a perfect will and plan and that it will come about in His time, we take matters into our own hands instead of trusting God.

Many times, a person repents and claims to recognize their sinful ways just like Saul did. But the validity of repentance and a changed heart isn't demonstrated by the emotion or sincerity of a moment. It is demonstrated by the ongoing direction of one's life, and David had every right to say, "I'm going to stay in the stronghold until I see the direction of Saul's life."
